

Written Homework 4

1) Find the complex Fourier series of the following functions

$$g(x) = \sin x \quad -\pi < x < \pi$$
$$h(x) = \begin{cases} 0 & \text{if } -1 < x \leq 0 \\ 1 & \text{if } 0 < x < 1 \end{cases}$$

Answer: For $g(x)$, we have that the coefficients are

$$c_n = \frac{1}{2\pi} \int_{-\pi}^{\pi} \sin x e^{-inx} dx$$

which you can do directly. Of course, it is easier to remember that

$$\sin x = \frac{1}{2i} (e^{ix} - e^{-ix})$$

and so we see that the Fourier series for g is just

$$G(x) = \frac{i}{2} e^{-ix} - \frac{i}{2} e^{ix}.$$

For h , we get

$$c_n = \frac{1}{2} \int_0^1 e^{-inx} dx$$
$$= \frac{i}{2n} (e^{-in} - 1)$$

if $n \neq 0$, and $c_0 = \frac{1}{2}$. So we get the Fourier series for h is

$$\sum_{n=-\infty}^{-1} \frac{i}{2n} (e^{-in} - 1) e^{inx} + \frac{1}{2} + \sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{i}{2n} (e^{-in} - 1) e^{inx}.$$

2) If the complex Fourier series of the function $f(x) = e^x$, where $-\pi < x < \pi$, is given by

$$F(x) = \sum_{n=-\infty}^{\infty} c_n e^{inx}$$

then give the coefficients c_0, c_1, c_{-1}, c_3 .

Answer:

$$\begin{aligned}c_0 &= \frac{1}{2\pi} \int_{-\pi}^{\pi} e^x dx = \frac{e^{\pi} - e^{-\pi}}{2\pi} = \frac{1}{\pi} \sinh \pi \\c_1 &= \frac{1}{2\pi} \int_{-\pi}^{\pi} e^x e^{-ix} dx = \frac{e^{(1-i)\pi} - e^{-(1-i)\pi}}{2\pi(1-i)} \\c_{-1} &= \frac{1}{2\pi} \int_{-\pi}^{\pi} e^x e^{ix} dx = \frac{e^{(1+i)\pi} - e^{-(1+i)\pi}}{2\pi(1+i)} \\c_3 &= \frac{1}{2\pi} \int_{-\pi}^{\pi} e^x e^{-3ix} dx = \frac{e^{(1-3i)\pi} - e^{-(1-3i)\pi}}{2\pi(1-3i)}\end{aligned}$$

3) Convert the differential equation

$$\begin{aligned}\frac{\partial u}{\partial t} &= c^2 \frac{\partial^2 u}{\partial x^2} \\u(x, 0) &= f(x)\end{aligned}$$

the function $u(x, t)$ to a differential equation for $\hat{u}(w, t)$.

Answer:

$$\begin{aligned}\frac{\partial \hat{u}}{\partial t} &= -c^2 w^2 \hat{u} \\\hat{u}(w, 0) &= \hat{f}(w)\end{aligned}$$

4) Write an integral form of the solution to the heat equation on the whole real line with initial condition

$$u(x, 0) = \begin{cases} 1 & \text{if } |x| \leq 2 \\ 0 & \text{otherwise} \end{cases}$$

Answer:

$$u(x, t) = \frac{1}{\sqrt{4\pi c^2 t}} \int_{-2}^2 e^{-\frac{(p-x)^2}{4c^2 t}} dp.$$

5) Find the solution to the heat equation on the whole real line with initial condition $u(x, 0) = \delta(x-1) + \delta(x+1)$.

Answer:

$$u(x, t) = \frac{1}{\sqrt{4\pi c^2 t}} \left(e^{-\frac{(x-1)^2}{4c^2 t}} + e^{-\frac{(x+1)^2}{4c^2 t}} \right).$$
